


Full Implementation

Factors that drive RDs and RDNs to full implementation of NCP:

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1. Electronic Health Record allows for documentation of the specific care provided by the RD/RDN in a standardized terminology for:

- PatientsFamilies
- Caregivers Population Groups

2. Outcomes Research based on RD and RDN documentation of results of patient care, specifically:

 Useful to validate Evidence Based Nutrition Practice Guidelines Will prove the benefit of utilizing services of the RD and RDN

Factors that drive RDs and RDNs to full implementation of NCP:

3. Dietetics Professional Standards

 Commission on Dietetic Registration includes NCP Terminology material in registration exam for RDs, RDNs, and DTRs

•Accreditation Council for Education in Nutrition and Dietetics includes the NCP model in their current standards of education.

Dietetics Work: Critical Thinking

Dietitians have always done some type of:

- : nutrition assessment intervention
- monitoring and evaluation documented care
- communication with other members of the health care team.

However, they have not always:

- done this in a standardized way
 used the same word to describe the same thing
 officially named the particular dietetic problems seen and attempt to remedy
- · linked interventions to the underlying cause of etiology of the problem
- identified the signs and symptoms expected to change based on the interventions used
- clearly articulated whether the problem identified actually improved or resolved according to the plan

PES Statement

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This recognition has led to the development of:

•a step in the process called "Nutrition Diagnosis"

• the PES statement:

- P: Problem
- E: Etiology
- S: Signs and Symptoms

• a specific terminology to label and describe what happens in each step of the Nutrition Care Process.
